
First Kids ministry has many exciting crafts and games planned for this fall.



First Methodist Church Clewiston Finance Report August 2023

July financials reflect the activities of our church's giving, expenditures, and fund transfers for the month.

General giving totaled \$13,459.15 for the month with an additional \$14,987.00 received in special funds. This brings our regular giving to 34.88% of our goal for the year. Total disbursements were \$24,578.33 for the month, bringing our total expenditures to 50.8% of budgeted annual expenses. The General fund balance decreased to -\$33,702.71 with total funds on deposit including Special Funds and WIF account of \$119,099.34. These totals represent an increase in Budgeted needs of \$10,000 annually and represent additional costs associated with our music ministry.

Your continued support of our church through your presence and gifts is greatly appreciated.

The prepayment of apportionments to the Global Methodist Church was returned. The new GMC felt that monthly payments will be a practice they wish all churches to adhere to. There was a reversal of expenses in the Apportionment account to reflect this returned check. We will catch up on our monthly giving during August.

We had additional transition start-up expenses which were applied to our special and normal expense lines in July, these include initial payments for our property insurance with our new carrier, painting, and other expenses to prepare the parsonage for the Singleton family as well as moving expenses for the Singleton family from their previous appointment in Illinois. The relocation expenses and pastoral appointment expenses (salary and benefits) will be shared with First Methodist Church of Moore Haven.

The balance in the transition fund at the end of July totals \$8,944.94. The reduction from the June balance reflects a down payment being made for the new sign panels at the church. The total expense for the new signs will be approximately \$9,000. Additional expenses are anticipated for reprogramming the web page, and other associated disaffiliation expenses.

With the arrival of our new Pastor, Jonathon Singleton, in July we will begin the process of adjusting our annual budget for the remainder of the calendar year to reflect the changes in expense due to the pastoral sharing agreement with First Methodist Church of Moore Haven.

The checking account has been reconciled for the month.

She said before she came to the Children's Home, her grades were poor. That was mostly because she was not attending school on a regular basis. In fact, her grades were mostly C's, D's, and F's. The teachers at Legacy Scholars Academy gave her the extra help she needed to get back on track, and now she's making straight A's. One of her favorite classes is Yearbook & Journalism because she gets to do a lot of hands-on research and writing. Her other favorite class is Science, partly because she's always been interested in it, and partly because her teacher is funny. Ren will be starting her senior year at Legacy Scholars Academy, and she'll be participating in a dual enrollment program at Daytona State College. Ren stated that it is because of our financial generosity that she can attend this school and now has a chance on being successful. Shoebox time is rapidly approaching. The annual Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Ministry is the perfect opportunity for us to show children in other countries just how much they mean to us. Ninette and I have already ordered a wide variety of materials informing people about the ministry and you will soon be able to pick it up on the back counter of the Sanctuary. We will also have banks for your spare change.

Last year, for the first time, we purchased actual plastic red and green shoeboxes with the Samaritan Purse logo. They were much nicer than the cheap plastic ones we had previously used. We plan on purchasing these shoeboxes again at a cost of a little over \$2.00 a shoebox. In addition, shipping will be \$10.00 each. The cost to buy and ship our shoeboxes will be close to \$1,500.
