#### **DEATH IS SWALLOWED UP IN VICTORY**

Only Christ is the answer to the sum of all our fears, only His victory over death has the power to swallow up every enemy, our guilt and shame, and even the terrors of death and destruction. In First Corinthians 15:54-55 it says, "Death is swallowed up in victory. O Death, where is your victory? O Death, where is your sting?"

The Cross has rendered the enemy powerless, stingerless, impotent... Christ suffered and died for our sins on the Cross, and God has resurrected Him to eternal power over all evil. As a result, there is now available a greater deliverance and covenant of healing power because of the Resurrection of Christ. In fact, the promise of the Resurrection is that every place and corner where death and evil still lurks will be exposed and toasted by the blazing light of Christ's ultimate victory.

So, let us focus our prayers with **Second Chronicles 7:14**. This one verse is like a beam of light to release the victory over a world that needs fresh revival and reformation; as this Scripture says: "If my people who are called by my Name will humble themselves and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from Heaven, will forgive their sins, and will heal their land."

Pray for what? Revival, which means seeking God's face so that God's way of life may be restored. If we want God to heal our land, then Christians must humble themselves and earnestly seek his face, and turn from all wickedness as individuals and as a nation...

Even if the fear of evil has come in like a flood, the Spirit of the Lord has lifted up a Standard against the enemy as God's people pray. And what else can we pray for?

Since I felt a common thread with the individuals the great people of Sunrise assist each and every day, I felt honored to share a little bit of my story and the word that has followed me for the last 20 years of my life. Disabled is a word that as soon as one speaks it, automatically brings the limitations of its true meaning to the ears that hear it, often handcuffing the listeners mind into thoughts of pity, despair and helplessness for those individuals labeled with the "D" word. I think God changed everyone's mind at the Youth Center that evening with just a few quotes I found that unlocked those imaginary and limiting handcuffs our minds sometimes place on individuals, no matter their disability.

"Just because a man lacks the use of his eyes, doesn't mean he lacks vision." Stevie Wonder

"The only disability in life is a bad attitude." Scott Hamilton

"The world worries more about disability than disabled people do." Warick Davis

As a "D" individual, I can attest that these are three absolutely true quotes. Eyesight has nothing to do with vision, a great attitude can conquer any obstacle in life and while the world has the best intentions in mind, often overcompensation of its assistance limits those they are helping, not allowing them to display those tasks they can do, but rather focusing on what they can't. The fourth quote I shared that evening was quite eye opening to me, and really can apply to anyone reading this, no matter your "disability".

"Put a Go in front of the disabled. It spells 'God is abled'." Nick Vujicic

As I'm writing this article, I see none of the words I'm typing. The question is, am I disabled? Well, by the strict definition of the word, the answer is, of course. However, the people who are the closest to me know the quote I often tell them is the truth, only by God's grace, love and assurance.

God enables us all to become victorious over those unanticipated challenges life hurls our way, He's always by our sides, even when we're not aware of His presence. Never, ever get bogged down with something you can't do right now, whatever the reason. Rather, always focus your energy in what you can, and do it to the best of your ability. # First Methodist Church of Clewiston Finance Report—March, 2024

February financials reflect the activities of our church's giving, expenditures and reimbursements for the month. After accounting for reimbursements for Pastoral employment expenses from the Moore Haven Methodist Church the General Fund balance improved to -\$2,820.99.

General giving totaled \$15,653.00 for the month with an additional \$2,815.00 received in special funds. This brings our regular giving to 14.6% of our goal for the year. Total disbursements, net of reimbursements, were \$10,506.73 for the month, bringing our total expenditures to 13% of budgeted annual expenses.

The General fund balance increased to **-\$2,820.99** with total funds on deposit including Special funds of \$131,452.33.

We received \$7,648.41 in cost sharing reimbursement from the Moore Haven Methodist Church during February which improved the General Fund balance.

Our church experienced a significant \$27,752.00 maintenance expense during the month as the roof at the parsonage was replaced. Any special fund giving you feel led to provide for this project is greatly appreciated.

Your continued support of our church through your presence and gifts is greatly appreciated.
