

March financials reflect the activities of our church's giving, expenditures, and reimbursements for the month.

General giving totaled \$ 16,188.73 for the month with an additional \$3,200.00 received in special funds. This brings our regular giving to 23.14% of our goal for the year. Total disbursements were \$ 15,502.27 for the month, bringing our total expenditures to 24% of budgeted annual expenses for the current year.

Brenda Whidden continues to transition as the Director of Finance. Brenda has assumed the regular duties for reconciling the bank statements and creating the financial statements each month with minimal input from R.D. Williams. Brenda's willingness to take on this responsibility is greatly appreciated.

The checking account has been reconciled for the month.

GUIDANCE FROM THE INSIDE OUT

On April 7, sixteen Believers met once again for another thought-provoking message brought to us by Lindsay Hall which aimed squarely at how to perceive what guides our responses to our many emotions as we navigate our lives as Christians. The Disney movie, Inside Out, was explained, bringing forward for discussion some of the emotions all of us may experience during different seasons in each of our journeys.

In the animated movie the main character is guided by her nine named emotions, Joy, Sadness, Anger, Fear, Disgust, Anxiety, Boredom, Embarrassment and Envy. Each emotion jockeying for position in the forefront of a young teenaged girl's mind. Depending upon her responses or reactions to the emotional tug-of-war in her head, decisions and actions are made sometimes good, sometimes bad. Sound familiar? The fact that 8 of the 9 emotions that round out the characters in the movie lean towards the negative causing distress and unpleasant feelings, especially in today's world, are a clear reminder of how the enemy longs for us to dwell on those last 8, so he can try to crush our Joy.

However, we can be assured, no matter how much he tries, it's a losing battle for that deceiving pest. Our guidance and responses to each and every one of our **Inside Out** emotional characters when they pop up in our lives, and they will, can be gleaned from the Word of God. Calmly responding in context to our emotions and allowing our Lord to guide us, rather than quickly or brashly reacting to them is crucial to having peace with all of them, no matter the challenges in this life.

- Joy: Philippians 4:4 "Rejoice in the Lord always." We could really stop there, but here are solid shields against the enemy's attack within our minds for the other eight.
- Sadness: Psalm 34:18 "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted"
- Anger: **Ephesians 4:26** "In your anger do not sin"
- Fear: Isaiah 41:10 "Do not fear, for I am with you"
- Disgust: Romans 12:9 "Hate what is wrong. Hold tightly to what is good." •
- Anxiety: 1 Peter 5:7 "Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you."
- Boredom: Colossians 3:23 "What ever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord."
- Embarrassment: Romans 10:11 "Anyone who believes in Him will never be put to shame."
- Envy: **Proverbs 14:30** "A heart at peace gives life to the body, but envy rots the bones."

Our God knows we are all human, and from the very beginning knew that struggles of the world would torment and persuade us just as the enemy tempted His son and our Savior Jesus. Jesus was human and had the same emotions we all experience every day. Holding His hand as we walk through sunshine or storms in life that trigger our emotions, good or bad, is challenging at times, but is exactly what God's unfailing love wants for all of us. Lean into Him and let your Joy shine from the inside out for all to see, no matter the circumstance.


In May, we will be learning about the women who were with Jesus during his time on earth. We will discuss the stories of ...

On the outskirts of a small town was a big pecan tree growing just inside the cemetery fence. One day, two boys sat underneath the tree, out of sight, and began dividing the nuts they had gathered. Several dropped and rolled down toward the fence.

Another boy came along on his bicycle and heard voices from the cemetery. Closing in, he heard counting: "one for you, one for me." Terrified, he jumped on his bike and took off, almost running over an old man with a cane. "Come quick," said the boy, "I heard Satan and the Lord down at the cemetery dividing up souls." The man replied, "Beat it kid. I can't be bothered with such nonsense. Can't you see it's hard for me to walk?"

When the boy insisted, the man hobbled slowly to the cemetery. Standing by the fence they heard, "One for you, one for me. One for you, one for me." The old man whispered, "Boy, you've been tellin' me the truth." Shaking with fear, they peered through the fence, gripping the wrought iron bars of the fence tighter and tighter as they tried to get a glimpse. That's when they heard, "One for you, one for me. That's all, now let's go get those nuts by the fence and we'll be done." They say the old man made it back to town a full five minutes ahead of the kid on the bike!

The RMS Titanic was a British passenger liner that sank in the North Atlantic Ocean in the early morning of April 15, 1912, after colliding with an iceberg during her maiden voyage from Southampton to New York City. Of the 2, 224 passengers and crew aboard, more than 1,500 died in the sinking, making it one of the deadliest commercial peacetime maritime disasters in modern history.

I still remember going to a Titanic exhibit where all of us received boarding passes to the Titanic with the name of an actual passenger. It made the experience more personal. It really hit home when we stood at a large wall which had two lists, reminiscent of the same lists that were posted after the tragedy in the White Star Line's offices. Imagine anxious relatives waiting to hear the fate of a passenger they loved, and a company rep occasionally coming in to add a name to one of two lists: "Known to be saved" and "Known to be lost." One of my friends had the name of a passenger who was saved. His wife and kids had names on the "lost" list.

It's sobering when you think about it, because family and friends and everyone we know is also on one of two lists: "Known to be saved" or "Known to be lost." Not rich or poor. Not liberal or conservative. Not Religion X or Religion Y. Just "saved" or "lost."

At the end when the Lord and Satan are dividing up nuts like you and me, which list will we be on? Now is the time to make sure. Now is the time to make sure for our family and friends as well!
