LIFE'S ENDLESS TUG OF WAR

Eighteen Believers enjoyed a delicious Mexican smorgasbord at the festive Cinco de Mayo B&B gathering which was held at Denise Hatton's house. A big thanks to Denise for hosting and all the Believers who brought all of the savory food and goodies we shared that evening.

I was blessed to share a message with the group at the May meeting, and sweetened up everyone's pallets with a talk about the Fruit of the Spirit in **Galatians 5**. Inviting all in attendance to join me for just a few moments in darkness and close their eyes, we all shuttled back in time nearly 200 years and traveled deep in the Everglades and experienced a wise old Seminole Legend. My attempt to recite the legend in a Seminole native tongue worked as the group became silent as I told the story. I'll try it now with you as you read...

As the camp fire crackled and the heat of the day surrendered to the coolness of dusk, an old Seminole chief passed the *Legend of Two Wolves* to his grandson as they sat quietly on the ground in front of the fire deep within the Everglades. "My son, there is a battle waging deep within my heart, a battle between two wolves.", the old chief explained with a raspy soft voice from his many decades in the Everglades. "The first wolf is evil, he is anger, envy, jealousy, sorrow, regret, greed, arrogance, self-pity, guilt, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority, and ego.", the expressionless old chief said with a slow deliberate emphasis on each flawed trait. After a short pause, he continued, looking up from the fire and staring solemnly into a far Cypress stand, "The other wolf is a good wolf, he is joy, peace, love, hope, serenity, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, compassion, and faith."

Turning slowly toward his Grandson the chief concluded, "This same battle is taking place in your heart as well my son, and this clash will reside in every man, woman and child from now until the end of time." After a moment of silence, thoughtfully, the young Seminole Grandson asked, "Which wolf wins?" Without hesitation, "The one you feed.", the wrinkled and weathered chief replied, as a distant wolf hauntingly howled as if to emphasize the chief's key point.

I now welcome you back to Clewiston. The *Legend of Two Wolves* seems to have a direct parallel to what Paul writes in **Galatians 5:13-26**, particularly **verse 17** of the Fruit of the Spirit scripture of the challenge we face as Christians. **Galatians 5:17** "For the flesh desires what is contrary to the spirit, and the spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever you want." Our God has given us all free will, and all of us have a choice to make every waking moment of our lives while we live on this earth. The battle within us that both Paul writes of in **Galatians 5** and the old Seminole chief explains to his Grandson is between our flesh and our spirit, with an important third component we all possess and control, in that of our minds. Like a tug of war from our youths, the flesh is pulling one side of the rope, and the Holy Spirit residing within us stands ready and more than able to drag those fleshy thoughts and actions into the mud puddle once and for all. It's our mind and the choices we make in life, coupled with free will that give the added strength to one side or the other depending on which one we fuel, or as the Seminole chief tells us, which one we feed. Allow the Holy Spirit to take hold of the tug of war rope within you today and pull those selfish worldly thoughts and actions into the mud where they belong.

AN UDDERLY AMAZING LIFE LESSON

Florida's dairy industry is "udderly" booming, thanks to the farmers and dairy cows throughout the state that produce fresh milk.

About 125,000 dairy cows reside in Florida, producing around 300 million gallons of milk annually. Dairy cows are milked two to three times per day and each dairy cow produces about 6 to 8 gallons of milk daily. A gallon of milk equals 345 squirts of a cow's udder which equals a little over 21 squirts per cup if you are interested in such things!

All of this milk goes from farm to carton in just 48 to 72 hours, which is good news for us milk lovers. There are times when I really enjoy the juice of the cow. For me, there is nothing much better than having a nice ice-cold glass of milk with a warm chocolate chip cookie right out of the oven.

I learned a lesson though. I sniff milk before I drink it these days. It started over 40 years ago. I had just taken a batch of cookies out of the oven and popped one in my mouth. I reached for the glass of milk I had poured and took a couple of quick gulps to help wash it down.

What happened next was not pretty. Like the passage in **Revelation**, I spewed it out of my mouth. I learned something that day: There's a price to be paid for leaving milk out of the refrigerator too long. Good milk turns bad from being warm too long.

I've also learned over the years that good dispositions can turn sour for the same reason. If we let frustrations or aggravations or irritations simmer too long, we can stew ourselves into a bad attitude. Just as sour milk ruined the good cookie experience for me, sour attitudes can ruin something good for us and those around us.

The story of Mary and Martha in the Bible is a classic example of the sweet turning sour. Martha invited Jesus and the disciples to dinner. While Martha was busy doing all of the things that needed to be done, her sister was sitting down listening to Jesus teach. This irked Martha. What had started out to be an attitude of joy and service for someone special quickly curdled. Martha lost perspective and her focus turned inward towards herself and her situation. With time, she developed an attitude, and her attitude spoiled the gift she was offering.

A bad attitude can spoil something good. Satan knows that. Satan uses that. Notice that he didn't take Martha out of the kitchen; he took away her joy of serving in the kitchen. The adversary won't turn you against the church; he will turn you toward yourself in the church. He won't take you away from your work; he'll take away your pleasure in your work.

There is a life-lesson here for us to embrace. To keep an attitude from souring, treat it like you would a cup of milk: Keep it cool and check it regularly to make sure it's good. "Pleasant words (and attitudes) are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones."
