#### PASTOR JEFF'S CORNER



**COUNT YOUR MANY BLESSINGS**

This note comes to you while we are in North Carolina looking over our weather-beaten home and counting our blessings. The damage was nothing that a new roof, paint job and the removal of three trees would not take care of. But we count ourselves blessed because there were thousands of folks who lost their homes, never to rebuild or recover.

Hurricane Helena made her mark across the map on the eastern seaboard. Stormy weather is not a respecter of time, socio-economic background, or location. Over the past couple of years, we have seen severe rainstorms that dumped feet of rain; hurricanes and tornadoes that left death and devastation in their path and in areas we never thought we would see such events take place.

The Sunday we left for North Carolina, we sang the song *Count Your Many Blessings* during our worship service. The lyrics were composed by Johnson Oatman, Jr., born in 1856 and penned the song in 1897. He also wrote songs titled, *No, Not One* and *Higher Ground*. One article pointed out that he was not as good a singer as his dad, but he loved music, nonetheless. Johnson attended schools for ministry, served in the Methodist Episcopal Church, and began writing songs that we sing still today. He composed about 200 songs a year and by age 36 and compiled 5000 songs by the end of his life. As his story unfolded, it appeared to me that Johnson counted his blessings and made the best of what talents God had given him. Through his compositions, Brother Johnson had shared the Good News concerning Jesus Christ.

Are you counting the blessings God has provided in your life? If you are thankful for what God has provided, then we must ask the Holy Spirit to help us to be doers of God's Word in the world around us. Scripture reminds us that it is not enough for us to hear or listen to the Word of God. We are to actively live out what we learn by following Jesus. (James 1:19-27) John Wesley said, "The Gospel of Christ knows of no religion, but social; no holiness but social holiness. Faith working by love, is the length and breadth and depth and height of Christian perfection." Jesus said to love God and love our neighbor. We love God and our neighbor, when we put into action the Word of God written in our hearts.

God loves you and so do I.

The B&B Believers met once again on June 9 where 14 Believers braved an evening deluge to gather at the JPE office for another great time of food, fellowship and a message on the challenge of taming our tongues. We were all told as kids, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me." The nearly 200-year-old rhyme can be easily recited out of memory by all of us, but was what our parents told us, or what we've told our kids actually the truth?

Our words alone can't break a bone, however, the damage our itty-bitty tongues cause when they form words that are said to bring someone down are crushing to the spirit of those who hear those devastating words. Bones can heal, but the damage sharp words can cause can sever friendships, destroy close relationships and end even the best of marriages. In **Chapter 3 of James**, we are given a clear picture of a comparison of how a very large animal in that of a horse is controlled by the use of a bit in its mouth, and how a large ship is steered by the small rudder in it's stern. Both examples **James** gives us in **verses 3** and **4** show us the control and positive direction the small parts of these large objects can provide when they are used properly by the operator.

Conversely, in **verses 5** and **6**, **James** warns us of how our tongues, when used in boastful and unthoughtful ways, are like the small spark that will set ablaze destructive infernos that will not only leave a huge forest reduced to ashes, but likewise set the entire course of one's life on fire, and leaving itself set on fire by hell. **James 3:8** tells us, "but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison.", then reminds us in **verses 9** and **10** of our double mindedness as we praise our Lord and curse our neighbors out of the same mouth. While I know James' brother Jesus knew, I'm not sure James had the foresight of the two additional tongues we all now have in 2025.

Our thumbs have become an extension of our tongues in today's electronic age, creating a triple threat of the sparking tinderbox the slips of our tongues and wandering thumbs often cause. Before we speak, before we text, before we post, before we tweet, before we snap, before we TikTok, before we allow our words to be consumed by others, let's all remember what Jesus said in **Matthew 12:36-37**. "But I tell you that everyone will have to give account on the day of judgement for every empty word they have spoken. For by your words you will be acquitted, and by your words you will be condemned." Can you give your accounting Jesus speaks of in Matthew today? Let's all begin to speak, text and tweet like Jesus is right there with us, because he is always present, every moment of our lives. Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words can maim forever.

They cleaned the wood surfaces in the Sanctuary and then went to the Life Enrichment Center and did some other much needed clean up projects.


